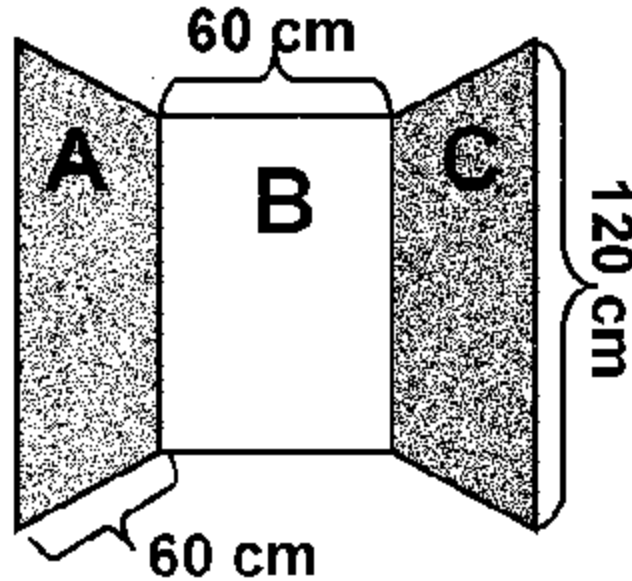


Tri-fold Senior Project Board



Your project board needs to be creative and legible. You will need pictures of your project throughout the process. Print pictures at least 5" x 7" for easy viewing. It must have large lettering that is spelled correctly. Make sure the one line phrase of what you did is on the board and your name displayed boldly. It needs to be colorful. Also creativity is part of your grade! Each picture must have a large caption. What other things might you use? You might use flyers from your project, tickets, materials, brochures, and anything you can attach that applies to your project! Remember to be creative and make it stand out!

1. Place all typed material on a colored backing, such as construction paper. Leave a border of 1/4 to 1/2 inch (0.63 to 1.25 cm) around the edges of each piece of typed material. Use a paper cutter or creative scissors, so that the edges will be straight or decorative.
2. Make your name title stand out by using larger letters for it and smaller letters for the project heading.
3. To arrange the letters on the backboard, first lay the letters out on the board without attaching them. Before adhering everything, ask the opinion of other students, teachers, or family members.

4. Bring an emergency kit with extra letters, glue, tape, construction paper the color of the backboard, stapler, scissors, pencils, pens, touch-up paint, markers, and so forth. This kit should contain anything that you think you might need to make last-minute repairs to the display.
5. **Do** display photos representing the procedure and the results.
6. **Don't** make the title or headings hard to read by using uneven lettering, words with letters of different colors, or disorganized placement of materials.
7. **Don't** hand-print the letters on the backboard.
8. **Don't** make mistakes in spelling words or writing formulas.
9. **Do** use contrasting colors and do limit the number of colors used.
10. **Do** display models when applicable. If possible, make the models match the color scheme of the backboard.

11. PLAN YOUR BOARD: 

- Make a small sketch of where everything will go. Lay it out before you glue anything down to make sure it looks good.
- Design what the "center" of your board will be. This is where everyone will look first. Will it be the title or pictures? Everything else should be place around this.
- When you set up your board, put things together in the an order that makes sense. Remember, we read from left to right so don't put stuff you did near the end (like the conclusion) on the left side of the board.
